## A functional-semantic account of case and adpositions

## **Abstract**

In this talk, it will be argued on the basis of data from Icelandic, German and a variety of other languages, that case is a functional category of the noun, signaling its relation to the selecting head word (as argued for by Bittner and Hale 1996 and others). It will be argued that structural cases such as the nominative and accusative can also be given this semantic explanation since their distribution is dependent upon reference saliency hierarchies (semantic role, animacy, volition, affectedness, etc.) and the presence of other cases. Furthermore, it is argued that lexical (idiosyncratic) cases such as the genitive can be associated with particular semantic roles, just like inherent (semantic) cases such as the dative and ergative. In fact, in agreement with Blake (2001) and others, it is argued that case can been put together into a relational category with adpositions, case being their synthetic counterparts.

In this framework, case does not represent uninterpretable features that must be deleted before the derivation is send to the interfaces, but instead the most peripheral functional category of the noun. It is also demonstrated that there is a disassociation between Tense and the nominative case in Icelandic, leaving nominative case to be assigned/selected in the vP by v or V (depending on construction).
