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Linguistics at the UB JCS

- Sondersammelgebiet (SSG) 7.11 (Special Subject Collection 7.11 General Linguistics. Comparative Linguistics)¹
 - funding period 1950 – 2015
 - collected, as comprehensively as possible and regardless of the country of origin, all publications written in European languages on general linguistics in the narrow sense including the neighboring or related disciplines
- ViFa Linguistik (Virtual Library Linguistics)²
 - 1. funding period 2012 – 2014
 - 2. funding period 2015 – 2017
 - build up the internet based research tool '*Lin|gu|is|tik* portal'

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Linguistics at the UB JCS

- Bibliography of Linguistic Literature (BLL)³
 - a source of bibliographic information for general linguistics with all its neighboring disciplines and subdomains as well as English, German and Romance linguistics
 - dates back as far as 1971
 - online version (BLLDB) is available to the public since 1977
 - references over 503,000 citations with an annual growth of about 10,000 citations
 - maintained by subject librarian Heike Renner-Westermann since 2003

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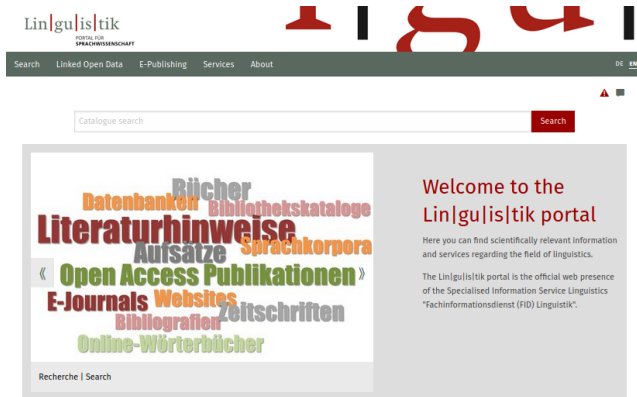
FID Linguistik

 - funding period 2017 – 2019
 - funding period 2020 - 2022
 - further development of the *Lin|gu|is|tik* portal (the official web presence of the FID Linguistik), E-publishing, licences for digital resources and acquisition of highly specialized literature

Abstract: In this paper I provide an analysis of the English hedges sorta and kinda, which show a cross-categorical distribution and can induce gradability with non- gradable predicates. I analyze sorta and kinda as degree words and provide a formal analysis of their behavior. With gradable predicates, these behavior similar to other degree words such as very, but with non-gradable predicates, a mismatch of logical type forces the predicate to typeshift to a gradable type, making available a degree argument that represents imprecision. The analysis is developed using Morzycki's (2011) implementation of Lasersohnian pragmatic halos (Lasersohn 1999), and presents a case study in how gradability may be coerced from non- gradable expressions.

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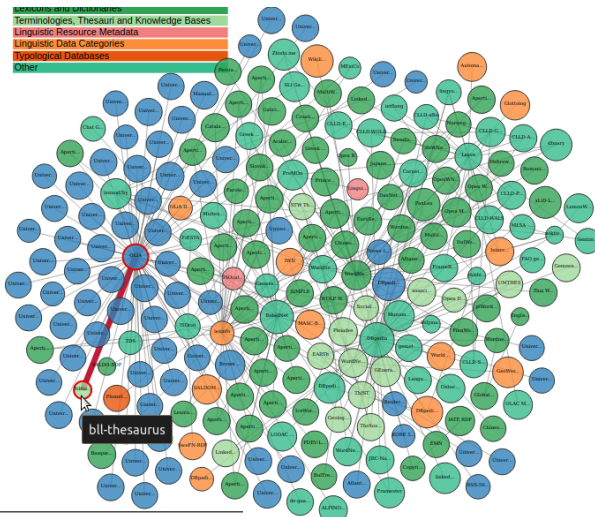

Why (L)L(O)D?

- LD because of the Semantic Web idea
- OD because of the open science movement
- LOD combines both ideas
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What have we done?

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 - OLiA (Ontologies of Linguistic Annotations)⁷ a repository of linguistic data categories
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 - Glottolog⁹: “a catalogue of the world’s languages” (Caines et al. 2016: 38) which provides a detailed language classification according to genealogical principles and a comprehensive bibliography

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Annohub

- What is Annohub?
 - a workflow dedicated to the collection of LOD metadata of online available language resources
 - ▶ analysis of resources with regard to object language and annotation scheme via the Annohub software¹⁰
 - ▶ mapping to the BLL subject terms
 - ▶ addition of BLL subject terms to the metadata of the respective language resource.
 - Annohub-Repository: the results from the analysis as well as basic descriptions of the resources (title, author, etc.) are stored in a metadata repository
 - the Annohub dataset is designed and published according to LOD principles¹¹

Annohub-Repository

Annohub is a repository containing metadata of language resources.

In the framework of FID Linguistik, a special web application was developed for the analysis of corpora and lexicons with regard to annotation scheme (tag set) and object language. The initial focus lies on freely available resources in RDF, CoNLL or XML format. The results of the analysis have been integrated in the Lin|gu|is|tik portal and published under an open licence.

This is a tabular overview of the Annohub resources. Frequently, one resource consists of several files (see *Details*).

Description	Universal Dependencies is a project that seeks to develop cross-linguistically consistent treebank annotation for many languages, with the goal of facilitating multilingual parser development, cross-lingual learning, and parsing research from a language typology perspective. The annotation scheme is based on (universal) Stanford dependencies (de Marneffe et al., 2006, 2008, 2014), Google universal part-of-speech tags (Petrov et al., 2012), and the Intersest interlingua for morphosyntactic tagsets (Zeman, 2008). This dataset refers to UD's Bulgarian treebank.

Licences and Open Access

- FID licences
 - provide access to electronic media (e.g. databases, journals) that are subject to licence fees
 - are supra-regional
 - they are meant for researchers affiliated with German academic institutions
 - vary depending on the product
 - realized with the financial support of the DFG
 - currently, two FID licences: Enhanced Electronic Grammars Online (EEG) and John Benjamins E-Journals

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 - The online resource features comprehensive descriptions of languages from around the world. The focus lies on small and endangered languages, like Bardi, Emai, Kwaza and Mapuche a.o. EEG makes available various full grammars simultaneously. The grammars are interlinked which allows precise cross-linguistic queries ¹³
 - acquired for a user group of 100 persons
 - access to the database EEG is provided via the portal of the Kompetenzzentrum für Lizenzierung where you have to register as individual user with your institutional email address
