
Grammar 23: Modifiers

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The grammar so far

There are only two grammar rules:



The Head Feature Principle (HFP)

The value of HEAD of a phrase is also the value of HEAD of the phrase's head-daughter.

A typical word




Illustration: the Head-Complement Rule





Illustration: the Head-Complement Rule + HFP



- The information in blue and green is a consequence of the Head-Complement Rule.
- The information in red is a consequence of the Head Feature Principle.

Nouns and verbs can be modified

Premodification of Nouns:

- (1) a. red apple
 - b. sweet red apple
 - c. juicy sweet red apple

Postmodification of Nouns:

(2) student fond of Kim

Nouns and verbs can be modified

Premodification of Verbs:

- (3) a. nearly fell
 - b. recently died
 - c. recently almost died

Postmodification of Verbs:

- (4) called Kim early
- (5) called Kim with an IPhone
- (6) called Kim early with an IPhone

Restrictions on modification

Modifiers differ as to what part of speech they can modify:

- (7) a. run quickly
 - b. * run quick
 - c. a quick run
 - d. * a quickly run

Modifiers differ as to the side of the head they can appear on:

- (8) a red apple
- (9) * an apple red
- (10) Robin called Kim early.
- (11) * Robin early called Kim
- (12) Robin called Kim repeatedly.
- (13) Robin repeatedly called Kim


Two additions to the grammar

We need two additions to the grammar to capture the behavior of modifiers:

- Information about modification in the lexical entries of modifiers.
- Phrase structure rules that combine a modifier with the head it modifies.


Information about modification in lexical entries

Since the head word of a constituent determines the constituent's modification behavior, we add information about modification to the head features:




Information about modification in lexical entries, 2

Two Modifier Rules

Prehead-Modifier Rule:



Posthead-Modifier Rule:



Illustration: the Prehead-Modifier Rule





Illustration: the Prehead-Modifier Rule + HFP



- The information in red is a consequence of the Head Feature Principle.
- The remaining information is a consequence of the Prehead-Modifier Rule.
